







Two types of activities:

Plug into screen or projector to display in-class.











Quizlet: Using vocabulary sets to quiz kids AND have them work collaboratively.


Can be used as a review or to introduce a new unit



Blooket: take your vocabulary sets and make them into a Kahoot-like game, but better. Students compete against each other in various ways, and they get pretty competitive.




A place to keep multiple media sources that can be shared with students and added to as necessary. Could be great for self paced learning, research projects where you want to limit resources, choice boards, etc.
